

- 3. The *Little River County Fair Management* shall have supervision and charge of all exhibits during the fair and reserves the right to control signs, advertising matter, and arrangement of exhibits for proper harmony and attractive appearance.
- 4. The *Little River County Fair Management* reserves the right to reject and accept, conditionally, any exhibits either before or after entry is made.
- 5. All judging will be done by competent disinterested judges selected by the committee in charge.
- 6. Premiums will be paid by check after the fair.
- 7. Persons moving exhibits before specified time will forfeit prize money.
- 8. No ATV's allowed on fair/rodeo grounds unless approved by fair board.

- 1. Entrants must be 4 6 years old by August 21, 2023.
- 2. Entrants must be resident within 50 radius of Little River County or attend school in Little River County.
- 3. Contestant must have a sponsor, the fee is \$35.00. The sponsor may be a family member.
- 4. Contestant fee may be waived by selling 20 advance purchase rodeo tickets. Contestant fee may be reduced by \$10 by selling 10 advance purchase rodeo tickets. Tickets sold may be picked up when you submit entry. It is your responsibility to distribute sold tickets.
- 5. Every contestant must ride in the fair parade on the float, except fair pageant winners. The parade is Friday, August 25th at 6:30pm in Foreman. Line-up at LR Memorial Clinic (formerly Regions Bank) on 3rd Ave. and Schuman St. You can pick up your child at the back of the rodeo arena.
- 6. The Tiny Tot King & Queen must participate in the Christmas parades in Foreman & Ashdown. You are responsible for your own float and signs.
- 7. The contestants must be dressed in western attire.
- 8. The contestants will be judged on Saturday night only. Contestants must participate on Friday night to be eligible to win.
- 9. All contestants will receive a trophy.
- 10. The Tiny Tot Queen will receive a crown, a sash, and a trophy. The Tiny Tot King will receive a belt buckle, a sash, & a trophy.

Eligibility & Application Process

- 1. Each contestant must sell 40 rodeo admission tickets. This takes the place of an entry fee and the proceeds go toward prizes.
- 2. Each contestant must ride in the LRC Fair Parade on Friday, August 25 at 6:30pm. Current Coggins papers are required.
- 3. Each contestant must ride in the Rodeo Grand Entry both nights and also be introduced on horseback both nights. Current Coggins papers are required.
- 4. Each contestant must complete a horsemanship pattern. After all contestants have completed their horsemanship patterns, then each contestant must be interviewed by the judges. An optional horsemanship practice will be scheduled.
- 5. Official rodeo dress will be required for each contestant: cowboy hat, long-sleeved shirt, jeans, belt, and boots. All other accessories are optional.
- 6. Contestants must live in Little River County or the counties that border Little River County (Sevier, Hempstead, Howard, Miller, Bowie, or McCurtain County).
- No contestant may have been married, pregnant, have a child, become married, become pregnant, have served jail time, or be convicted of a crime before or during their year of reign.
- 8. <u>Judges' decisions are final!</u> Score sheets will not be handed out after the crowning. Score sheets will be mailed to contestants the Monday after the crowning.
- 9. Unsportsmanlike conduct of any contestant or any family members will not be tolerated during the contest or after the crowning! Unsportsmanlike conduct may result in disqualification from contest, withdrawal of titles, or not being allowed to enter the contest in the future.

- 1. All businesses and organizations are invited to enter the Little River County Fair parade.
- 2. Throwing of candy will be permitted. Candy must be store bought and wrapped.
- 3. Entrant of horses will be allowed, although owners will need to provide proper papers before allowed to enter parade.
- 4. 4-wheelers will be allowed to participate as long as the cycle is decorated. There will be no hotrodding/horse playing with these cycles.
- 5. Pageant Winners are encouraged to decorate cars.
- 6. Pre-registration is required by 4 pm on Friday, August 25th.
- 7. Entrants need to be lined up by 6pm on Friday, Aug. 25th
- 8. Numbers shall be picked up before start of parade in front of LR Memorial Clinic (formerly Regions Bank) and placed on right side of entry.
- 9. Entries must complete entire parade route.
- 10. The parade winners will be determined by a panel of judges selected by the parade committee:
 Application to theme 50 points; Originality 30 points; Neatness and Attractiveness 10 points;
 Quality and Completeness 10 points
- 11. Judges decisions are final.
- 12. Any questions or decisions not covered in the above rules will be determined by the Parade Chairperson or Committee.

The Premium Sale is a tax-deductible donation by the buyers to the 4-H and FFA exhibitors of Little River County. The money is used to help defray expenses of the project and encourage them to continue participating in a livestock project. Exhibitors must show their animal during the Premium Sale. Only market animals are eligible for the Premium Sale. Every effort will be made to pay premium before State Fair.

OBJECTIVES: To further youth development through livestock projects by:

- 1. Learning methods of livestock production.
- 2. Developing sense of fair play and self-discipline.
- 3. Learning record-keeping and management practices.
- 4. Understanding economics of agriculture.
- 5. Developing personal pride and leadership qualities.

Premium Rules:

- Rule 1. Student (owner) must show his/her animal at LRC County Fair to be eligible for Premium Sale or Add-on monies. In order to receive Premium Sale or Add-on monies exhibitor <u>must</u> show livestock at the Little River County Fair and SW District **and/or** State Fair to be eligible for Premium Sale or Add-on monies.
- Rule 2. If premium sale money is drawn at the LRC Livestock Show Premium Sale; the exhibitor and exhibitor's animals must represent Little River County Fair at the SW District and/or State Fair.
- Rule 3. Any exceptions must be approved by the Premium Sale Committee based on the advice of the student's Ag Teacher or County Agent.

ARKANSAS LIVESTOCK

2023 Exhibition Health Requirements

COUNTY, DISTRICT AND STATE FAIR LEVEL

- 1. All animals entering the grounds, including those showing in pet zoos, children's barnyard animals, Old McDonald Farms, etc., must meet the requirements of their particular species.
- 2. Arkansas livestock (except for Arkansas sheep, goats, horses, steers and rabbits) must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within 90 days prior to exhibition, showing the following:

ARKANSAS CATTLE

- 1. If Arkansas is a Class Free State, Arkansas cattle are exempt from brucellosis testing. If Arkansas is not a Class Free State then the following testing requirements must be met: Negative brucellosis test within ninety (90) days prior to exhibition, for females and bulls eighteen (18) months of age and over. All heifers that have calved or are bred must be tested. Animals originating from a Certified Brucellosis Free Herd are exempt if the Certified Free Herd number is shown on certificate.
- 2. All heifers that are four to twelve (4-12) months of age shall be vaccinated before entering show.
- 3. Heifers that were born on or after January 1, 1985, that are over twelve (12) months of age and are not official calfhood vaccinates will not be allowed to show (unless they are from a Brucellosis Certified Free Herd.) This will not apply if Arkansas continues as a Brucellosis Free State.

ARKANSAS SWINE

- As of July 1, 2001, all swine must have an official premise identification.
- 2. Animals six (6) months old or older to be tested negative for brucellosis within ninety (90) days of exhibition or originate directly out of a Validated Herd, with Validation number and date of last herd test shown on certificate (barrows exempt from brucellosis testing but must be pseudorabies tested.)
- 3. Animals to be tested negative for pseudorabies regardless of age within ninety (90) days of the exhibition on a test approved by the state veterinarian or originate directly out of a Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd, with Qualified Herd number and date of last test shown on certificate.
- 4. Free of other contagious, infectious, and communicable diseases (erysipelas, atrophic rhinitis, etc.); otherwise, they will not be allowed to show and will be released from fairgrounds.

ARKANSAS SHEEP AND GOATS

- 6. Equipment may be removed from barns on Friday, August 18th, 2:00 pm.
- 7. All livestock will be shown in the ring for judging **by owner** unless special permission is arranged with the Livestock Committee before the show.
- 8. All breeding animals must be registered, and registration papers or due proof shown to the Superintendent, except Commercial Heifers.
- 9. The *Little River County Fair Management* reserves the right to prohibit the exhibition of any animal.

- 1. All birds entered in the LRC Livestock show must be Pullorum-Typhoid tested 90 days prior to show date. The date for poultry to be tested will be advertised.
- 2. Documents of Pullorum-Typhoid Testing must be presented before poultry can enter the fairgrounds.
- 3. All participants must have attended Bio Security training prior to turning in an entry form for LRC Livestock Shows. Dates for these trainings will be advertised and Certificate of completion must be presented upon arrival to the LRC fairgrounds.
- 4. All birds are subject to a health check prior to entering the fairgrounds. If any bird or birds exhibits signs of infection, contagious disease, or parasite infestation will be sent home upon discovery. In severe cases all poultry entries that came from the same location (families with multiple exhibitors or from location where multiple exhibitor's birds have been housed) could be sent home.
- 5. Exhibitors are responsible for providing water bowls for their animals to use while on the fairgrounds.
- Poultry show will be a carrier show. Chickens will not be permitted to enter the grounds before the scheduled time and must vacate the grounds after the show has concluded.
- 7. Chickens must be brought in a cage or container that they can be judged in (wire cage or dog kennel) with a door that can accommodate an individual bird to be removed.
- 8. Breeding chickens will be broken down into breeds or breed classification depending on quantity.
- 9. Grand and Reserve Champion in each Breed Class will receive a rosette.
- 10. The overall Supreme Breed Chicken will each receive a buckle and a banner.
- 11. Commercial birds will not be allowed to show in the breeding chicken show and breed chickens will not be allowed to show in the commercial show.

 Exhibitors ages 9 19 years of age will be allowed to show in the meat pen and fryer classes. The Grand Champion Meat Pen and Grand Champion Fryer will be in the premium sale. All other breeds are open to 5 up to 19 years old.
- 2. All rabbits not permanently tattooed in the left ear will be eliminated as per the ARBA rule. PLEASE CHECK YOUR TATTOOS.
- Any animal showing signs of sickness or disease will be REMOVED from the showroom and entries forfeited.
- Any EXHIBITOR indicating ownership of animal at judging table, harassing, interfering with or attempting to influence the judge will be asked to leave the show and will forfeit all fees and winnings.
- Awards will be awarded at the show. Exhibitors point checks will be mailed out.
- 6. YOUTH MUST PUT RABBITS ON THE SHOW TABLE unless given prior permission by the show officials.
- All breeders are responsible for getting their rabbits to the show tables.
- Substitutions shall be allowed only in the same sex, class, variety, group and breed.
- NO ONE ALLOWED BEHIND THE SHOW TABLE unless acting in an official capacity, which must be approved by the show superintendent.
- This club reserves the right to refuse entries from all locations within 150 miles of any confirmed outbreak of RCD/RHD/VHD within the past 60 days.
- 11. NO changes will be allowed at the show table.
- 12. There must be ten (10) or more animals judged before the sponsoring club is required to pay the awards required by the Specialty Club. Awards donated and not paid by the sponsoring club will be paid regardless of the number shown.
- 13. All rabbits are entered and shown at the risk of the owners and/or exhibitors, and while show sponsors are expected to exercise all reasonable care in the handling and protection of the exhibit, show sponsors will not be liable.
- 14. Each animal must be exhibited in is natural condition. An exhibitor in violation of this rule will have their animal disqualified, and remainder of their entries maybe disqualified from competition and not be judged. Examples include dyeing, plucking trimming, or any other designed to deceive.
- 15. Classes will be called to the table three times only. Please listen.

STANDARD & GUIDE FOR JUDGING MEAT CLASSES:

- 1. Meat Pens: The four factors, in the order of their importance, for judging meat pens, are as follows: (1) Meat type, (2) condition, (3) Uniformity, and (4) Fur.
- 2. Meat pens shall consist of (3) rabbits, all of the same breed & variety. Pointed animals must all have the same point color. Broken meat pens must also be of the same variety. A meat pen does not necessarily have to come from the same litter. Age limit 10 weeks. Minimum weight 3 1/2 pounds each. Maximum weight 5 1/2 pounds each. All rabbits must be weighed in the presence of the judge.
- Disqualifications from competition- All ARBA Disqualifications from Competition and breed Disqualifications from competition apply to each meat pen, with the following exceptions: Body smut on Californian or Himalayan marked animals. Non-descended testicles on bucks.

- 4. The exhibitor MUST BE IN POSSESSION of the Meat pen or Fryers on or before July 28, 2023 and registered & Tattooed with the Livestock Superintendent by July 28, 2023. Registration will take place at the LRC Fairgrounds on July 28, 2023 at 7:30pm 8:30pm and must take place with Livestock Superintendent and Rabbit Director. Rabbits to be exhibited for meat pen/fryer classes must be present and tattooed at this time. Only exhibitors ages 9 19 are eligible to compete in the Meat pen or Fryer show. Registration fee \$5 per exhibitor.
- 5. Parent and Exhibitor must sign the "Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Agreement (RHDV2) recognizing the importance of following all biosecurity recommendations and procedures and agree to follow them. By signing this agreement, you agree not to transport any rabbits into your possession or premises that could potentially cause harm to other exhibitors and their rabbitries from this date forward.

ARKANSAS BRED SHOW

- All General Rules & Regulations listed for Arkansas State Fair Livestock Competition & Little River County Fair Association apply. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to read & understand these Rules & Regulations.
- 2. To be eligible for competition, whether single or in groups, animals must have been owned by the owner not less than 30 days prior to the opening day of the LRC Livestock Show.
- 3. Entries must be made in the name of the owner. All livestock will be shown in the ring for judging by owner unless special permission is arranged with the Livestock Committee before the show.
- 4. The Little River County Fair Management reserves the right to reject and accept, conditionally, any exhibits either before or after entry is made.
- 5. All judging will be done by competent disinterested judges selected by the committee in charge.
- 6. To be considered for Arkansas Bred Champion, animal must be born and bred in Arkansas. Dame of said animal must be owned by Arkansas breeder. Animal must be owned and showed by exhibitor who is an Arkansas resident. Partnerships with out of state breeders will not be considered Arkansas bred.
- 7. Breeders participating in this program MUST be a member in good standing with the ArMGA or ASC.
- 8. July 1st is the ownership deadline for exhibitors.
- 9. Exhibitors may show three (3) Arkansas bred animals. Exhibitors of these animals will be the only ones allowed to exhibit them at County, District, or State Fairs. Exhibiting them at any other Fair in the name of another individual or family member could make them ineligible to participate in the program.
- 10. It is recommended that animals be dehorned but is not mandatory. Animals with horns must be blunt tipped to the size of a dime.
- 11. Entries will be examined to assure they have all their baby teeth, & show no symptoms of disease, external parasitism, or active ringworm lesions in accordance with Arkansas Livestock & Poultry Commission requirements.
- 12. Open to youth of any age. Can show 1 year after graduation. Exhibitor must be able to show animal unassisted. Unruly animals will be asked to leave the show ring.
- 13. Persons moving exhibits before specified time will forfeit prize money.
